NWC FASD Network Services

Northwest Central FASD Network Regional Supports: awareness, prevention, education, training, assessment, diagnostic, clinic support, caregiver support, mentorship.

Sexual Exploitation and Human Trafficking, Western Canada

Not a Number prevention program for target audiences of youth, people with disabilities, newcomers, immigrants and Indigenous persons available in Edmonton and area. The Train the Trainer program available in Ontario, Manitoba, Saskatchewan, British Columbia, Yukon, Northwest Territories and Nunavut.

Restorative Justice, Northern Alberta

A voluntary alternative to punishment available to address harm caused by crime for justice involved including people with FASD or Brain Domain challenges. Focus is on healing and repairing the harm caused to people and relationships through restorative practices and justice circles. Can be offered pre or post sentencing. Offered in Northwest Central FASD Network service region and Edmonton and area.

Correction Facility Support & Services

The In Reach program is offered in all provincial correctional facilities across Alberta. WWSN provides In Reach Services including Correctional Services Induction Training, Facility Staff Training, Sharing Sessions for facility residents, FASD referrals, documentation of Prenatal Alcohol Exposure (PAE) history, and Transition Mentorship upon release for those with confirmed PAE. Transitional Mentorship offers short-term support for individuals transitioning from a facility back into the community. Key priorities include assisting with documentation completion, providing referrals to community and government supports, and establishing connections to food security, housing, and treatment programs.

WRAP 2.0 FASD Professional Development and Instructional Coaching

An all-expenses-paid Professional Development and Instructional Coaching for all educators (early childhood to Grade 12) working with students who may benefit from additional educational support.

WRAP 2.0 is designed to provide educators with **practical, evidence-informed strategies and individualized instructional coaching** to support students with FASD, other brain-based disabilities and more.
